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### Background

- Directive (EU) 2018/2001 on the promotion of renewable energy sources (RES) was adopted in 2018
- The RES Directive benefits from a structured dialogue between the participating countries, as well as from common approaches and solutions
- The Concerted Action (CA-RES) supports the implementation of the RES Directive and the achievement of the EU target



#### What is a Concerted Action?

- Structured, confidential dialogue between national authorities implementing an EU directive
- Through a Concerted Action, the participating countries exchange experience and best practices, participate in a cross-learning process and develop common approaches



### **Objectives**

- Facilitate a structured exchange of information, experience and good practice regarding the implementation of the Renewable Energy Directive (EU) 2018/2001 between participating countries,
- Encourage dialogue between participating countries to develop common approaches for the implementation of particular parts of the Directive,
- Support the effective implementation of the Renewable Energy Directive (EU) 2018/2001 in participating countries





### **Expected Results**

- Consolidation and strengthening of the network of experts and the information-sharing framework.
- Exchange best-practice examples and share experience in key areas
- Coordinated implementation and common approaches where they are beneficial
- Mutual support on the implementation of the Directive will be encouraged.
- Participants will identify possible areas for potential future convergence amongst MS.

- Joint initiative of EU Member States (plus Norway and Iceland) and the European Commission (DG ENER, CINEA)
- Duration: 1 June 2021 31 January 2026
- Confidential process
- Co-funded by the Horizon 2020 Programme of the European Union


