




#### Job and skill impacts of greening

- European Green Deal skill forecast scenario
- About 2.5 million additional jobs by 2030
- Employment benefits in most sectors, some negatively affected (e.g., coal mining)
- Indirect employment benefits mainly for service-based sectors (e.g. ICT, real estate)

<u>Cedefop (2021) The green employment and skills</u> <u>transformation</u>

- Up-/reskilling for all workers:
- Targeted policy for 'key' and 'thyroid' occupations
- VET for workers' transitions in 'brown' sectors (e.g. conventional electricity)
- IVET to prepare future workers for green(er) jobs










#### Employment in construction, 2008-2022 (data for Q2)





#### Employment shares of key occupations in construction (in %)









Key for energy savings and green energy production


Still a "low-tech" sector, but digitalisation is on the rise
